## Current National and International Collaboration

- „Family Diversity across the Life Course”: This project uses longitudinal data to analyze life-course transitions that occur before and after family formation.
- „Assisted Reproductive Technologies (ART)”: This project in collaboration with Prof. Dr. Anne-Kristin Kuhnt (University of Rostock) uses administrative data of the German IVF-Register (DIR) and of the German Family Panel (pairfam) to investigate the utilization of ART and its determinants in Germany.
- „Determinants of Parental Investments in Children in the US and in Germany”: This project is a collaboration with Prof. Regina Werum (University of Nebraska-Lincoln, USA). Based on time use data for the years 2012 and 2013 surveyed in the US and Germany, we address the question in which ways different welfare states and economic conditions in both countries shape how parents of minor children spend their time and how they invest into the next generation.
- „Gender, Status, and (In)Visibility in the Social Sciences”: Project being conducted in collaboration with Dr. Nadja Milewski (Federal Institute for Population Research, Wiesbaden). Based on data of the two German sociological journals with the highest reputation, we analyze the publications and reviews over a time period of the last 25 years with a special emphasis on gender and status.
